

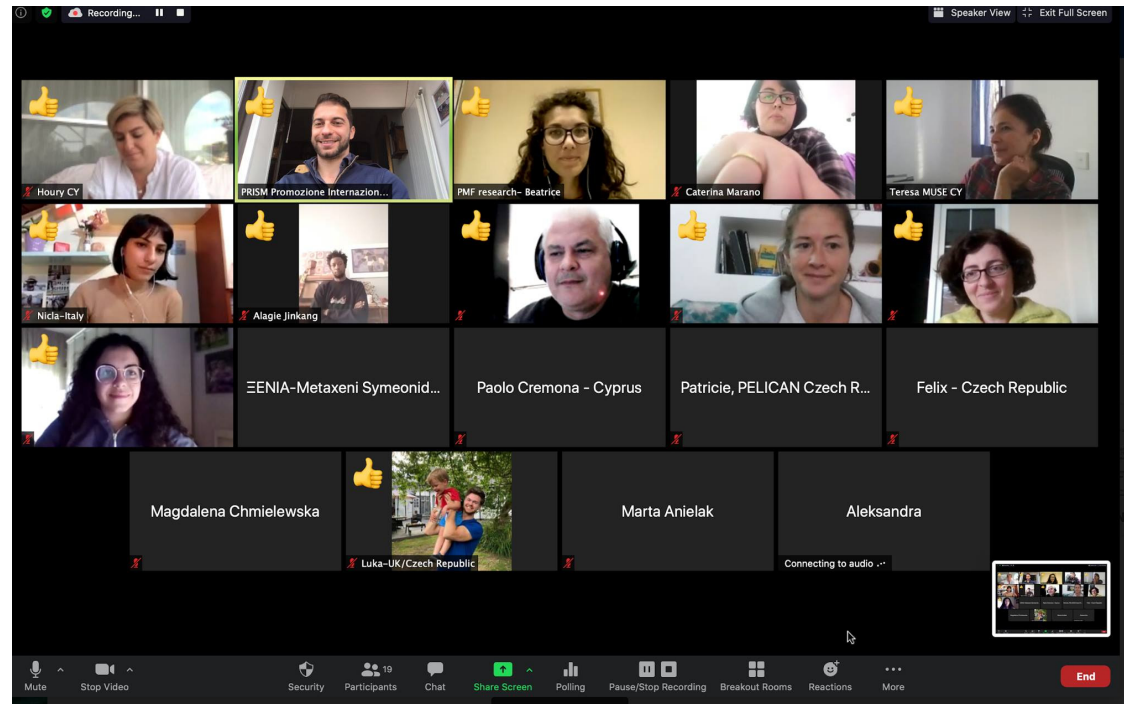

GOALS

By creating TK we aimed to produce the Educational tool dedicated to young people for the purpose of the language classes with emphasis on intercultural Exchange between the two groups: migrants and locals through music.

The objective of the TK is to design and develop the content for the educational methods of acquiring new language knowledge through music with the emphasis on the cultural component, by providing the migrants and locals with the answer to the basic question on how to work with language through music.

We want the young people not only to gain extra motivation for language learning, but also to equip them with more cultural awareness.
