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INTRODUCTION TO THE NEWCOMERS@WORK PROJECT

NEWCOMERS@WORK is a project in the field of youth employability, which addresses the needs of the NEETs for work and inclusion in the labour market and in the local society. It also aims to train youth workers, in order to provide them with the necessary skills and tools that will facilitate and improve their work with young people with a migrant background.

WHAT DO WE WANT TO ACHIEVE?



The general objective of the project is **the social inclusion and empowerment of newly arrived young NEETs aged 18-25, with a refugee or migrant background, through the improvement of their employability skills.**

We will focus on creating a safe space for the NEETS, providing training opportunities according to their needs, establishing their career goals and aspirations, preparing them to enter the labor market, and mentoring support in their first career steps.

Newcomers@Work Curriculum: a curriculum that will respond to the needs of youth workers and facilitate the delivery of learning activities in non-formal settings.

Newcomers@Work Digital Toolbox: a series of tools dedicated to employers to support the integration of young NEETs with refugee/migrant backgrounds.

Newcomers@Work Implementation Guide: a tool that will support the successful integration of young refugees/migrants into the labour market.
