Recognition of non-formally acquired knowledge through local networks (LRNs) is the main theme of the international REVEAL project. It brings a range of benefits to businesses, policymakers and the wider community, helping to create a more skilled and innovative workforce and foster economic and social development.

Several studies in the European context show that progress has been made in the recognition and validation of non-formal and informal learning experiences in the EU. However, there is a need to raise awareness among individuals and employers. Further steps are also needed to make recognition procedures more transparent and to provide resources. Practice can help to address these issues. Best practice will be available to LRNs, based on cooperation between local stakeholders, clear recognition criteria, a focus on outcomes, and tailored evaluation to support lifelong learning. It is crucial to change the debate on the skills gap from a negative to a positive perspective: the gap is an opportunity to discover and develop skills.

Moreover, during the seminar, the potential of local initiatives to transcend geographical boundaries was highlighted.
