◆ MATCHING YOUNG PEOPLE WITH EMPLOYERS



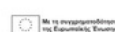
One of the core ambitions of Newcomers@Work is to match 350 young NEETs with employers for mentoring and on-the-job learning experiences. This stage is now actively underway in all six countries.

Each partner is approaching this process in a way that fits their local context. Some are working through youth centres and social services, others have launched open calls to engage employers, while others rely on strong networks of NGOs and municipal services.

LOCAL IMPLEMENTATION IN PROGRESS

What unites us is a shared commitment: to give each young person involved a valuable, tailored experience that supports their growth and confidence in the labour market.

Youth workers and employers are already collaborating to design learning paths and mentoring opportunities. Early results show how powerful this process can be — for both the young participants and the communities around them
